The North Dakota Securities Commissioner has advised the Respondent, Kenneth Lynn Copen, (CRD #2160692) that he is prepared to commence formal action pursuant to NDCC Chapter 10-04 and has determined as follows:

- In or around April of 1999, respondent applied to be registered as a securities salesman in the state of North Dakota with Janus Distributors,
   Inc. a broker/dealer registered in North Dakota. The Commissioner granted the registration of respondent as a salesman in North Dakota on April 9, 1999.
- 2. After the Commissioner approved the respondents' registration, the Commissioner learned that in the application, respondent provided the Commissioner with false and misleading information regarding his involvement in a burglary in 1969. Respondent stated that he was not an actual participant in the burglary, though he later acknowledged that he was the person who actually took the money which was the basis for the burglary charge.
- 3. On July 21, 1999, after the Commissioner learned that respondent made false and misleading statements in his salesman registration, respondent terminated his employment with Janus Distributors, Inc. and withdrew his salesman registration in North Dakota.

- 4. The facts set forth above constitutes one violation of §10-04-15 N.D.C.C., and is sufficient grounds for the Commissioner to impose civil penalties against the respondent in an amount not to exceed \$10,000 for each violation, pursuant to §10-04-16 N.D.C.C.
- 5. Based on the facts as set forth above, the Commissioner issued his Order,
  Notice of Civil Penalty and Notice of Right to Request a Hearing on
  August 20, 1999, wherein the Commissioner assessed a civil penalty
  against the respondent in the amount of \$5,000.

The following Order is necessary and appropriate in the public interest.

## NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED, THAT:

- Respondent, Kenneth Lynn Kopen, shall not transact any securities business with any person in North Dakota unless the securities are offered through an organization which is registered as a dealer or properly exempted under Chapter 10-04 N.D.C.C.
- Respondent, Kenneth Lynn Copen, shall not act as a securities salesman for any securities business with any person in North Dakota unless he is registered as a salesman or properly exempted under Chapter 10-04 N.D.C.C.
- Respondent, Kenneth Lynn Copen, shall pay a civil penalty of \$1,000 to the Office of the Securities Commissioner pursuant to §10-04-16 N.D.C.C. Such civil penalty shall be paid immediately upon execution of this Consent Order.
- The Commissioner's Order, Notice of Civil Penlaty and Notice of Right to Request a Hearing dated August 20, 1999 is hereby vacated.
- 5. This Order shall be effective upon signature of the Commissioner.
